Tricks, Treats, and Trivia: Fort Pitt Museum to Host 21+ Night
-The after-hours 21+ program will feature food and drink from local breweries, history trivia, and lantern tours of Point State Park-

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 9, 2019 – The Fort Pitt Museum, part of the Smithsonian-affiliated Senator John Heinz History Center museum system, will host a **21+ Fort Night: Tricks, Treats, and Trivia** on **Saturday, Oct. 26 at 6 p.m.**

This after-hours program for guests ages 21 and older will explore Pittsburgh's 18th-century history and feature libations from local breweries, including Maggie's Farm Rum, Southern Tier Brewing Co., Spoonwood Brewing Company, Threadbare Cider House & Meadery, Voodoo Brewery, and The Vandal.

Guests can sample food and drinks from participating breweries and put their history knowledge to the test during trivia with Buzzworthy Pub Trivia.

The program will also feature lantern tours of Point State Park after dark beginning at 6:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Throughout the evening, visitors can explore Western Pennsylvania history through two floors of interactive displays and award-winning exhibitions, including the Fort Pitt Museum's newest exhibition, ***Pittsburgh, Virginia***, which explores how Pittsburgh almost became a permanent part of Virginia.

Tickets for this program are \$25 general admission and \$20 for Heinz History Center members. Tickets are available online at heinzhistorycenter.org/events or at the door.

Please note: All guests must have valid ID and will be carded prior to entry.

The **Fort Pitt Museum**, built in a recreated bastion of the British fort originally constructed in 1759, focuses on the critical role that Western Pennsylvania played during the French & Indian War, the American Revolution, and the founding of Pittsburgh. The Fort Pitt Museum is located in Point State Park in downtown Pittsburgh. The Senator John Heinz History Center, an affiliate of the Smithsonian Institution, operates the Fort Pitt Museum in partnership with the
